If you have no income (or very little income) for the month and you need help right away, you may qualify for Expedited SNAP benefits within 7-days. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits are issued to households on an electronic benefit transfer (EBT) card, called the Independence Card. You use this card to buy your food.

Eligibility Rules - Maryland Department of Human Services

The food stamp income guidelines for the state of Maryland are set by the USDA and are based on the federal poverty level (FPL) and household size. The USDA uses the FPL to set both net and gross monthly income limits. Gross monthly income refers to the amount of money a household has before certain expenses and taxes are deducted.
